2006

Mindanao Trust Fund Reconstruction and Development Program (MTF-RDP)

Assisted the Bangsamoro Development Agency (BDA) in community planning, programming, and program implementation through the “learning-by-doing” approach. Livelihood and infrastructure projects began in six pilot sites, which benefited nearly 13,000 people.



2007

Community-Driven Development/Community-Driven Reconstruction (CDD/CDR)

Provided infrastructure, facilities and livelihood support to 204 more villages in 75 municipalities.



2012

Framework Agreement on the Bangsamoro (FAB) is signed

Program for Local Economic Development through Enlightened Governance and Grassroots Development (PLEDGE)

With BDA, supported an enterprise program to help improve livelihood and provide employment to about 1,178 beneficiaries in conflict-affected communities



2013

Operational Assistance to the Program Management Team (PMT) of Sajahatra Bangsamoro

Helped the MILF co-deliver with government health, education, and livelihood programs to conflict-affected communities. Sajahatra Bangsamoro was the first joint government and MILF peace and development initiative.

Bangsamoro Development Plan

Provided technical support as the BDA formulated an inclusive and comprehensive development roadmap. The BDP is the first development plan written by a revolutionary group.



2014

Comprehensive Agreement on the Bangsamoro (CAB) is signed.

Bangsamoro Development Plan is launched.

Released during the Philippine Development Forum, the BDP generated support from government, business groups and the international community. BDA, now with over 400 staff in seven regional offices, helps in development and investment planning for Mindanao.



2015

Institutional Strengthening Agreement (ISA)

Supported the BDA as it strengthened its operations to better deliver services on the ground, enhanced the management capacities of 30 best-performing People’s Organizations, and rolled out a BDP awareness campaign.

Sajahatra Bangsamoro program closed.



2016-2017

Camps

With the GPH-MILF Task Force on Camps Transformation and CFSI, livelihood and infrastructure support were provided to communities in the Six Acknowledged MILF Camps.

Bangsamoro ADVANCE

With BDA, assisted remote communities in the influence area of the 25 MILF base camps to plan, implement and manage projects.

Bangsamoro Solidarity

Widened inclusive reach to help 10 tri-people communities in Davao, South Mindanao and Zamboanga Peninsula have better livelihood and access to services.

PLEDGE project closed.



2018-2021

Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL) passed in mid-2018 and ratified in early 2019.

Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) established and Normalization of MILF combatants commenced in 2019.

COVID-19 Pandemic strikes the Philippines and lockdowns movement limitations imposed since mid-March of 2020.

Mindanao Trust Fund Reconstruction and Development Project Phase 2 (MTF-RDP/2)

Geared towards improving access of communities located in the Six Acknowledged Camps of the MILF to basic socio-economic infrastructure and alternative learning system as well as strengthening the capacity of the BDA while working with the CFSI and Normalization Mechanisms.

The Mindanao Trust Fund (MTF) comes to a close in June 2021 and the Bangsamoro Normalization Trust Fund (BNTF) is established with the signing of a MOU between OPAPP and the World Bank.

Conflict Monitoring and Participatory Processes in the BARMM (2020-2021)

Aimed at monitoring the incidence of violent conflicts and strengthening the capacity of stakeholders in the BARMM for participatory, inclusive and conflict-sensitive resource-based planning and management, particularly in Marawi City, Kapai, Bubong and Ditsaan-Ramain in Lanao del Sur.

Mindanao Trust Fund Reconstruction and Development Project Phase 3 (MTF-RDP/3; 2001)

Building on the success of MTF-RDP/2, this phase focused on the building of socio-economic infrastructures and the provision of productive skills training to broaden economic opportunities, and the building of health infrastructures to prevent and mitigate health risks from the COVID-19 pandemic. BARMM Ministries were linked to the communities and project activities for sustainability.
